Hawaii has produced NFL players in the past, but hasn't had the same luck recently. Quarterback Cole McDonald was the last player from Hawaii who was drafted. McDonald was drafted in the seventh round of the 2020 NFL Draft. McDonald was selected by the Tennessee Titans.
